John Ourensma

John has been Director of Music at Hillsdale First United Methodist Church, Hillsdale, Michigan, since January 1, 2013. He assists in planning worship and playing organ/piano for all services, has revived and now directs a mixed choir of 20 voices (which includes several music interns from Hillsdale College) and directs a hand bell choir. Additionally he has initiated a successful Community Concert Series of up to five programs per year, one of which is his own annual



organ recital. Two new community outreach initiatives include an annual summer music camp that draws children from all over Hillsdale County, and an Early Childhood Music Class for kindergarten age children and their parents. The church is committed not only to strong music and worship within its own walls, but also strives to share quality music programming with the community in the name of Christ.

Before coming to Hillsdale, John was a voicer and pipemaker for Dobson Pipe Organ Builders, Ltd., Lake City, Iowa. During his time with Dobson from 1999 to 2012 he was involved with the design and building of nineteen new pipe organs, including the large new concert hall organ for the Kimmel Center for the Performing Arts, Philadelphia, the new organ for The Cathedral of Our Lady of the Angels, Los Angeles, as well as instruments for churches of more modest size. John also worked in sales of new instruments and was responsible for the firm's semi-annual newsletter. He served as organist and Director of Music at Lake City Union Church, where he played Dobson Op. 13 and directed the choir. He has also given organ demonstration recitals at Union Church for regional tours sponsored by the Lake City Betterment organization. John has taught private organ, piano and voice for many years.

Prior to his work in Lake City, John spent nearly 25 years in full-time church music ministry, serving churches in Virginia, Ohio and, before moving to Iowa in 1999, was Director of Music and Organist at First Presbyterian Church, Battle Creek, Michigan. In each position he served as church organist and pianist and directed a full program of vocal, handbell choirs and various instrumental ensembles. He was deeply involved with worship planning and the development of congregational singing. Prior to his professional appointments he served as part-time organist at various churches, including his home church, since he was eleven years old.

John received his Bachelor of Arts with a major in music from Calvin College, Grand Rapids, Michigan, and went on to earn the Master of Music degree in Organ and Church Music from Northwestern University, where he was student of Richard Enright.

Our dream of building a pipe organ began when Steve Denmark came to St. Dunstan's in 2010. We had an electric organ then, and Steve inspired us to think bigger. In those days, we literally laughed at the idea of building a new pipe organ because it sounded like such an enormous project! But the dream started to gain traction, as dreams often do.

Through much prayer and visioning, we engaged the remarkable people of Dobson Pipe Organ Builders, Ltd. of Lake City, Iowa to design and build an organ specifically for our unique space. They had just completed an organ for the chapel at Merton College, Oxford, and their next organ after ours is for St. Thomas Fifth Avenue in New York. We could not be happier with their attention to detail throughout the project, not to mention the heart and soul that they put into our new organ. They spared no effort to make sure that everything was just right, and you can hear the difference.

I am thrilled to share with you that, just two years after the organ was finished, we have completed fundraising on the entire project. This has been thanks to the faith and generosity of more than 150 households, including many local people who love music who are not even members of the parish. We thank you all from the bottom of our hearts!

Our dream has come to fruition, and we are incredibly pleased to share the glorious sounds of this magnificent instrument with our local community. I believe that all music is spiritual, and I hope that the music you experience here will lift your heart.
