Priest Let us take a moment to draw to mind and heart the people and situations we want to

pray for, and the thanksgivings we want to offer. Silence.

Priest Gracious God, receive our prayers; hear our hearts' deep yearnings yet to be formed

into words. Give us the courage to yield ourselves, all that we are and have yet to become, to the transforming power of your Holy Spirit, this Day of Pentecost, through

Jesus Christ risen and living, now and forever. Amen.

Priest Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbor.

Silence may be kept.

People Most merciful God,

we confess that we have sinned against you in thought, word, and deed, by what we have done, and by what we have left undone.

We have not loved you with our whole heart;

we have not loved our neighbors as ourselves.

We are truly sorry and we humbly repent.

For the sake of your Son Jesus Christ, have mercy on us and forgive us; that we may delight in your will, and walk in your ways,

to the glory of your Name. Amen.
